About 500 children have died from hunger in Sudan since fighting erupted in April, charity says

AP News, by Samy Magdy: About 500 children have died from hunger in Sudan - including two dozen babies in a governmentrun orphanage in the capital of Khartoum — since fighting erupted in the East African country in April, a leading aid group said Tuesday. Save the Children also said that at least 31,000 children lack access to treatment for malnutrition and related illnesses since the charity was forced to close 57 of its nutrition centers in Sudan. Sudan was plunged into chaos after monthslong tensions between the military and a rival paramilitary force exploded into open fighting on April 15. The conflict has turned Khartoum and other urban areas into battlefields. Many residents live without water and electricity, and the country's health care system has nearly collapsed. "Never did we think we would see children dying from hunger in such numbers, but this is now the reality in Sudan," said Arif Noor, Save the Children's director for Sudan. "We are seeing children dying from entirely preventable hunger."

When a few quarters ago the Sabbath School lesson talked about "Stewardship," it created some kind of disagreement among the class; for me it was nothing new or difficult to understand, but I have to learn we all are in the process of growing in the faith, and that growing takes time, patience, love...

We were raised in the Catholic church, attending Sunday school, masses, whatever biblical class the church offered to children, and we went to elementary and middle school in a Catholic school; our teachers were nuns. My sister reminded me our dad gave us allowance on Sunday to get some treats after the children's mass, but that



money had to be divided in half for the treat and half for the offering collected during the service. We never argued about the amount we gave because if our dad said half to the offering, that meant half to the offering.

Moreover, when in August the nuns came back from vacations to start the school year, my dad went to the big grocery market in town and bought beans, rice, lard, flour, sugar, cleaners, paper, and what he thought the nuns may need in their home since they were out for two month. At Christmas time the nuns will return the favor giving us a bunch of buñuelos they cooked. My dad taught us we are responsible in helping God's people.

Every time I see the children in our church collecting the offering reminds me we all are responsible in helping God's people. We are passing the torch to our children, and that makes us a stronger church. As Proverbs 22:6 says: "Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it."
